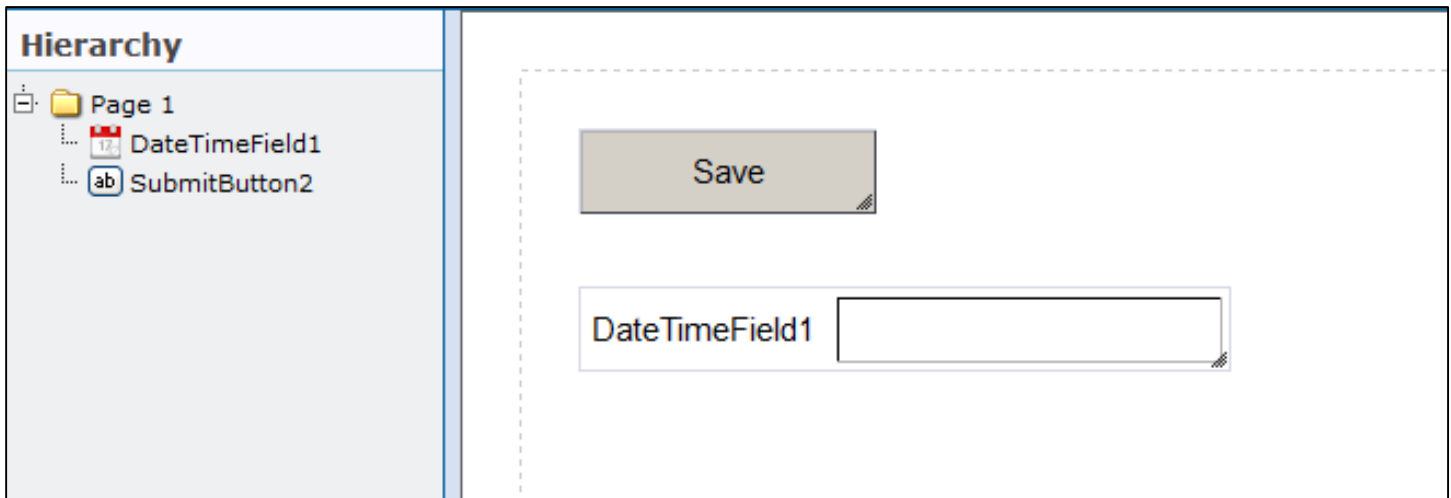

PDF forms and SharePoint are better together

Solve problem  
with date change

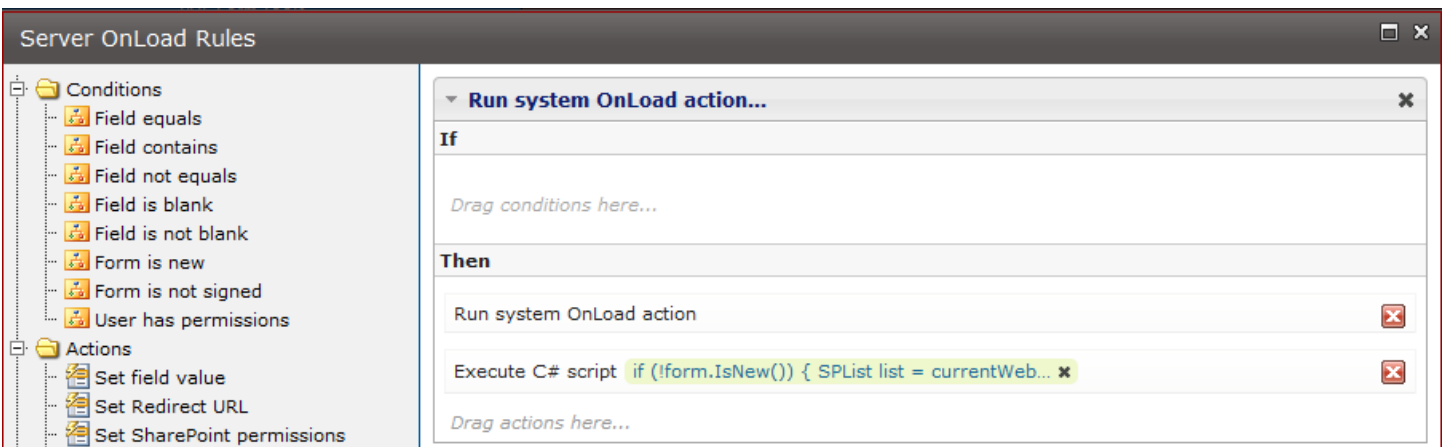
Date and Time values often can cause some issue due to specifics of different countries. SharePoint also have few issues related to DateTime fields and SharePoint locales. Date in PDF ShareForms is saved according to document locale but is loaded using configurations specified in SharePoint. For example the period from 03.12 (12 of March) till 04.01 (1<sup>st</sup> of April) after submitting and opening the form — date is rolled back for one day due to daylight saving time. To fix it we just load data directly as it is, ignoring any modifications which SharePoint may apply. This guide will describe how to produce it.

**Step 1.** Prepare template:



Template contains **DateTimeField1** and **Submit** button.

**Step 2.** Add script to Form Load (PDF Form Tools → Developer → Form Load):



Add “Execute script” action under “Run system OnLoad” action and place inside it following code:

```

if (!form.IsNew()) {
    SPList list = currentWeb.Lists["LibraryName"];
    SPListItem item = list.GetItemById(form.DocumentID);
    string datetime = item["DateTimeField1"];
    string[] date = datetime.Split(' ');
    data.resolveNode("DateTimeField1").value = date[0];
}

```



This Code will get value from SPList and put it into "DateTimeField1".

**Step 3.** Deploy template.

**Step 4.** Create new form and fill it.
